| Prop 1A | Support ✓ | STATE BUDGET. CHANGES CALIFORNIA'S BUDGET PROCESS. LIMITS STATE SPENDING. INCREASES 'RAINY DAY' BUDGET STABILIZATION FUND. The general view at LCHC was that this is a far less than perfect measure, but given the current economic conditions we cannot wait until the best possible plan is formulated. As well, this proposition extends temporary sales tax increases (sales tax, vehicle license fees, and personal income taxes) approved in February 2009, thereby avoiding deeper cuts to basic services. |
| Prop 1B | Support ✓ | EDUCATION FUNDING. PAYMENT PLAN. There was a strong sense of responsibility to our schools and that our commitment to ending social inequities is also a commitment to ensuring a quality education for Latino children. Because 1A and 1B work together to ensure that the Proposition 98 guarantee is met, this concern would be addressed. |
| Prop 1C | Support ✓ | LOTTERY MODERNIZATION ACT. This measure increases lottery payouts and allows for the State to borrow funds from the lottery. This is a revenue source that if pursued could generate more than \$5 billion in additional revenues without a tax increase. Although the financial outcomes of securitizing future lottery proceeds is not certain, given the current \$42 billion deficit we cannot afford to disapprove of a measure that would bring in additional revenues. |
| Prop 1D | Oppose ✗ | PROTECTS CHILDREN'S SERVICES FUNDING. HELPS BALANCE STATE BUDGET. This measure would take half of the revenues derived from Proposition 10 taxes (First 5 Commissions) and redirect it to the General Fund. This program also provides direct services and covers immigrant children's health, including the undocumented, through county-based Children's Health Initiatives. Additionally, Prop 1D would be in effect for 5 years and the use of redirected funds is subject to appropriation from the Legislature. Therefore, in the future Prop.10 funds could potentially be used for purposes at odds with children's health and preschool education. |
| Prop 1E | Support ✓ | MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FUNDING. TEMPORARY REALLOCATION. HELPS BALANCE STATE BUDGET. This proposition would use a portion of the revenues raised by Proposition 63 (Mental Health) to offset General Fund expenditures. This measure will only last two years, unlike the five years in Prop 1D. More importantly, the transferred funds will be dedicated to support EPSDT, a federally mandated program that provides diagnostic and mental health services to Medi-Cal recipients under 21. |
| Prop 1F | Neutral = | ELECTED OFFICIALS' SALARIES. PREVENTS PAY INCREASES DURING BUDGET DEFICIT YEARS. Public sentiment supports this proposition. Nonetheless, LCHC's Board of Directors was mindful that 1F does not reflect the role of the two-thirds vote requirement in the state's budget mess. Moreover it is not tied to 1A and 1B, as it should have been. While Prop 1F is a symbolic gesture at best, it will hardly bring savings to the state resulting from the suspension of proposed pay raises to the California Legislature. |
