SB 677 (Hernandez)	Medi-Cal: Eligibility: This bill would provide, to the extent required by federal law, that the department shall not apply an assets or resources test for purposes of determining eligibility for Medi-Cal or under a Medi-Cal waiver, except as specified. This bill would also require, to the extent required by federal law, the department to use the modified adjusted gross income of an individual, or the household income of a family, if applicable, for the purposes of determining income eligibility for Medi-Cal or under a Medi-Cal waiver, except as specified. AB 415 (Logue)	Healing Arts: Telemedicine This bill would prohibit a requirement of in-person contact between a health care provider and patient under the Medi-Cal program for any service otherwise covered by the Medi-Cal program when the service is provided by telehealth, as defined. The bill would prescribe the rate of reimbursement for covered services provided by telehealth and would provide that reimbursement for telehealth interactions would include reasonable compensation to the health care provider at the originating site for the transmission cost incurred during the delivery of health care services. AJR 10 (Brownley)	School-Based Health Centers: Supports the school-based health center program authorized by the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; supports an appropriation by the United States Congress to fund the school-based health center program; and, supports the inclusion of school-based health centers in the reauthorization of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act as an important strategy for ensuring that pupils are physically and mentally healthy and therefore ready to learn. AB 52 (Feuer)	Health Care Coverage: Rate Approval: Requires health care service plans (health plans) licensed by the Department of Managed Health Care (DMHC) and health insurers (collectively carriers) certificated by the California Department of Insurance (CDI) (collectively regulators), effective January 1, 2012, to apply for prior approval of proposed rate increases, under specified conditions, and imposes on regulators specific rate review criteria, timelines, and hearing requirements.
